

## Phase I DEFINING




"A transformed Ugandan society from a peasant to a modern and prosperous country within 30 years".

% under-fives, 2014





# Phase III CONNECTING

The People's Summit on Food













'The interaction between the different stakeholders - rural farmers, food vendors, government leadership (political and technical) - ensured a rare occasion of learning from one another.

In our planning system, we rarely integrate the food system along the entire value chain. We normally concentrate on urban planning and development planning without thoroughly integrating the food system as a cross cutting issue. This gap needs to be addressed as cities and towns continue to grow. Over 60% of the population in Uganda is expected to be in urban areas by 2040. We pledge that in the preparation of the third NDP this this will be done. We need to work with the nutrition working group of government to further this discussion.'
